#### **NEWS FROM THE BOARD**

At the last meeting, we looked at the midyear assessment data for Maths, Reading and Writing.

While most students are making progress with their learning, there is a significant number of students who are performing well below their expected level.

#### In Year 7

20% of students are well below in Reading 23% of students are well below in Writing 21% of students are well below in Maths



#### In comparison,

Year 8

1% of students are well below in Reading 6% are well below in Writing 3% of students are well below in Maths



Because of this, the Board funds two additional part-time teachers to give support to many of these learners.

#### Rosehill Intermediate School Enrolment Process

The Rosehill Intermediate School Board of Trustees invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their child/ren at Rosehill Intermediate School for 2025. Hard packs are

available from the school office from the 6th September 2024.

Parents of students who live within the home zone should apply as soon as possible to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office and online from our website www.rosehillintermediate.school.nz.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is **27th September 2024**.

The Board has determined that 50 places for Year 7 and Year 8 students are likely to be available for out-of zone students next year. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required it will be held on **14th October 2024** and parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.
