News From the Board

At Rosehill Intermediate every student has the opportunity to participate in 2 technology classes per week. In addition to this, we have music and art specialist teachers who provide programmes for all classes. Here is an example of some of the work that the students create.

Multi-Materials

Resins, Lasers & Gaming

The Year 7 students have been designing computer games and the Year 8 students create their own vector designs which are then cut or engraved with the laser cutter. Students use either wood or acrylic for their design.

Meanwhile, another class focuses on woodwork skills using a scroll saw, file, carving tools, sand paper, wood stain, glues and wood sealer, plus making pvc moulds, mixing and pouring resin with optional additives of glitter, jewels, shells, a picture, dye and paint.
